Summer Term 2 – June/July 2021

English

As readers, we will be reading African stories such as Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain and traditional African tales, comparing them to well-known fairy tales, focusing particularly on Cinderella.

As writers, children will write postcards and construct posters and fact files for African animals. The children will also learn the important skills of letter and diary entry writing, while imagining they are in the role of an African explorer or on safari.



Mathematics

This term, Year 1 will be learning about number: place value (within 100) and Year 2 will be revisiting addition/subtraction of two 2-digit numbers.

Year 1 and 2 children will all be learning about measurement of time and using money.

Science Wild and Wonderful Creatures As scientists we will:

- Sort animals into different groups and learn all about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- Create shoe box/bottle dioramas for the animals and annotate with researched information.
- Learn about different habitats.







PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about money.

Computing

We will use Google Earth and online maps to find out about the seas and continents.

We will begin to use Scratch Jr as an introduction to animation and programming.

Geography

As geographers we will:

- Name and locate Africa on a map and name the oceans and other continents, using maps, globes and Google earth.
- Identify and compare seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK with Africa.
- Learn about the Maasai people and the countries Kenya and Tanzania.
- Use photographs to find out about a foreign country.
- Find similarities and differences between the life of a child in a Kenyan school and our lives in the UK
- Explore some of the problems that children face in going to school in some parts of Kenya.
- Find solutions to problems faced by schools in Kenya.

Music

As musicians we will be:

Listening to the Carnival of Animals, identifying the different animals and discussing the use of rhythm and pitch.


Learning some traditional African songs.
