Science

As scientists we will be:

- Learning about the characteristics of birds including their structure.
- Bird watching and using our senses to guide us into making observations and new discoveries.
- Studying birds in the school grounds.
- Understanding the life cycle of a bird, in particular that of a chicken and looking closely at eggs and feathers.
- Naming different birds, looking closely at British birds.
- Using video clips and first hand observations to learn about British birds.
- Growing edible plants and understanding what plants need to grow.
- Making bug hotels.

We shall be:

- Learning about e-safety with Lee and Kim from the very useful thinkuknow website.
- Using Purplemash to explore making music.

Music

As musicians we will:

- Respond to Classical music.
- Explore and express ideas and feelings about the music: The Swan by Saint-Saëns.
- Understand how sounds can be made in different ways.
- Play tuned and un-tuned instruments.
- Organise musical ideas to make a group composition.



Art/DT

As artists and designers we will:

- Use imagination and real life observations to develop art work in sketch books.
- Learn about farming, produce and healthy eating.
- Be planning a teddy bear's picnic and designing and making our own healthy picnic skewers.





History/Geography

We will be:

- Learning about the first flights and the Wright Brothers with a special Wright Brothers day.
- Using basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical and key human features.
- Using the story Rosie's Walk and our own toy hen to explore the school and its grounds.
- Using aerial photographs and planning perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devising a simple map; and using and constructing basic symbols in a key.
- Conducting travel and traffic surveys.



Doubling and halving.

Halves and quarters. Use place value and number facts to solve

problems, e.g. 60 - = 20. Add a 2-digit number and 10s; add two 2-digit numbers that total less than 100 by counting on in 10s and 1s.

Count back in 1s or 10s or use number facts

to take away, e.g. 27-3 = or 54-20 =. Telling the time, to half an hour, quarter past and quarter to on analogue and digital clocks.

We will be:

- Keeping Healthy.

Please make sure your child has their reading packet in school and encourage them to say if their book needs changing. The most valuable homework you can do with your child is reading together to improve fluency and talking about what you have read to help with comprehension. Remember to practise any words or sounds in their plastic wallets as well.

The children will continue to receive spelling homework every Friday and are working hard on their letter formation (please encourage your child to form their letters correctly at home, checking particularly 'b' and 'd' and that they are holding their pencil correctly).
