Year 4 can look forward to a leavers' trip, a Strawberry Tea, a leavers' assembly and participating in kayaking activities run by the Coquet Shorebase Trust at Druridge Bay Country Park. Seabirds will also take part in School Games competitions and a beach school session run by Mudlarks. We will also be creating class videos to showcase what we have been doing in school this term and share these with you via Class Dojo.

I recently had a meeting with representatives from Northumberland County Council regarding the ongoing safety issues outside our school gates. Arising from this meeting they have agreed to make the stretch of road outside our school an advisory 20mph zone during key points in the day and signage is due to be erected to this effect in the near future. They are also considering the feasibility of additional traffic calming measures to be installed.

Our Year 4s recently took part in a speed awareness road sign competition and the winning poster will be made into signs to be displayed around our area. Thanks to Councillor Scott Dickinson for arranging this.

I am still receiving feedback that one or two of our families are pulling up on the yellow zigzags. These zones have been marked out to help prevent a serious accident occurring and I would ask the very small minority of car drivers who continue to pull up in these areas to re-consider their actions and park safely.
