### Welcome to the Big Owls!

Our topic for this half term is

# All Grown Up!





Children will learn about how they, and others, change as they get older. They will learn about their bodies and how to keep them healthy as they grow. Children will learn about jobs of people they know and think about what they would like to do when they grow up.

#### All Grown Up

### Personal, Social and **Emotional Development**

Children will talk positively about themselves and their abilities. They will be encouraged to share experiences from their home life. They will talk about their feelings to recognise different emotions in themselves and others. The Big Owls will also help the younger Little Owls at shared learning times.

#### **Mathematics**

Children will secure their knowledge of numbers to 10 by counting, ordering and When counting out a specific matching numerals. number of objects from a larger group, we will help children to recognise when to stop and we will also practise counting on from any number up to 10. Children will also compare height and size as they look for items that are taller or shorter than them.

Children will have daily access to the outdoor environment to enhance their physical development. They will develop their gross motor skills through multiskills activities and they will take part in parachute games to promote team work. Children will develop fine motor skills with activities across the unit in the finger gym, in the playdough areas and through mark making.

**Physical Development** 

#### PE Uniform

Please send children to school in PE uniform every Friday. This includes a white t-shirt, dark coloured shorts or joggers and trainers. Wear usual school jumpers or cardigans.

#### **Communication, Language and** Literacy

Children will take part in lots of speaking and listening activities as they talk in groups about themselves and their experiences. They will be encouraged to speak clearly in sentences and to listen carefully to others. Children will learn about babies, children and families through a variety of stories. They will think about their own abilities and illustrate their own "I can..." They will also participate in daily books. phonics activities.

#### **Understanding the World**

Children will be encouraged to talk about their friends and family and use their own experiences in their play. They will learn about their bodies and the names of different body parts. We will look at teeth and skeletons to learn about ways to keep them healthy and strong as they grow. Children will think about the type of jobs they would like to do when they are older.

#### **Helping at Home**

**Getting dressed** – Encourage your child to become 'all grown up' by dressing themselves, putting on their own shoes and also zipping up their own coats.

**Reading** – Encourage a love of reading by sharing lots of story books together. Talk about the pictures and the characters. Try to guess what will happen next.

Maths – Practise counting out different numbers of objects from a larger group. E.g. get 4 spoons out of the drawer.

#### **Expressive Arts and** Design

Children will engage in lots of role play throughout the topic including playing in the home corner with familiar things and visiting the doctors surgery to look after patients and help everyone stay healthy. They will also enjoy working in the baby clinic to look after new babies by weighing them, feeding them, bathing them and changing nappies. Children will have opportunities to be creative as they paint self portraits and mark out life-size body shapes.
