Dear Parents

This is one of the loveliest times of the year to work in a school, with all the excitement and activities in the run up to Christmas. Thank you for attending our recent Parents' Evenings. I hope you found them informative and gave you some ideas on how you can help your child's learning at home. We are encouraging all parents to listen to their children read aloud on a regular basis. This extra practice really does help progress, as does practising any sounds, reading of 'tricky words' and spellings that class teachers issue. For mathematics, helping your child to learn key facts, particularly number bonds and times tables, will make this subject much easier. Although we practise these in school, a little and often approach is needed, so again extra sessions at home can make all the difference.

We raised £140 at our Harvest Festival and this has been donated to the British Red Cross. We hope that those of you who were able to attend the festival enjoyed the afternoon. Thank you very much for your generous donations for our Harvest Table and for your monetary contributions.
